


**OBSERVATIONS:**

1. Most of the students are attending the classes with full interest, to gain knowledge and to study the subjects and a very few students are attending by compulsion (attendance)
2. As per student's feedback, most of the teachers are very interactive, motivating the students, and they are having very depth knowledge. And some of the junior faculty members are handling the classes only in theoretical manner and not discussing with practical examples
3. Only 50% of the students are supporting for group work and team work in the departments. It can be improved by assigning more team work tasks.
4. For visiting other industries, laboratories, and other universities, only 40% of the students have shown interest.




**OBSERVATIONS:**


1. Only 75% of the students actively participated in sports activities, this can be further improved by increasing the sports activities in the campus and encouraging the students.
2. Among the 75 % of the students, 65% of students have satisfied with the equipments and amenities provided for sports and remaining 35% students were not satisfied by the facilities.
